Revelation 15

Opening question: Have you ever served on a jury or been to court? What was the experience like for you?

Scripture study: Revelation 15

- Read 15:1. What is John about to witness? Why is the subject of God's wrath difficult to talk about? What is a correct understanding of the wrath of God and God being a judge? Have you been on the receiving end of an injustice? Is it wrong to want justice to be served? What should be our attitude when it comes to injustices?
- Read 15:5-8. What does John see? What can be said of these images? What are some similarities between what John sees and the time of Moses? What do you know of the 10 plagues and what purpose did they serve in Moses' day? What might be the connection between what took place in Moses' day and what is to come of these judgments?
- Trace the connection between what is handed to the seven angels (verse 7) and 5:7-8 & 6:9-11. How does Revelation 15 answer their cry for justice and what does this say about God?
- Read 15:2-4. Spend some time looking at the different words used in this song. How would verses 2-4 be an encouragement to the saints in John's day? How should they encourage and bless us today? How does knowing that God will make all things right in the end help us live for Him today? Under what circumstances do we need to remember that the most?
